BIOGRAPHIES

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Professor Patricia Davidson

Professor Patricia M. Davidson is an Australian nursing educator and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Wollongong. She is best known for her contributions improving cardiac nursing and transitional care with a focus on underserved populations in a global context, and for her leadership in higher education. From 2013 to 2021 she was professor of nursing and dean of the School of Nursing at Johns Hopkins University.

Prior to joining Johns Hopkins University as Dean of Nursing in 2013, Professor Davidson was a Professor at University of Technology, Director at Curtin University, and member of the faculty of Western Sydney University.

In 2007, Davidson was inducted as a Fellow of the Australian College of Nursing. In 2013, she was inducted as a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, a Fellow of the American Heart Association, and a Fellow of the Preventive Cardiovascular Nursing Association.

In 2021 she was the recipient of the Consortium of Universities for Global Health (CUGH) Distinguished Leader Award. This honour celebrates her exceptional contributions to the advancement of global health worldwide.

As a global leader in nursing, health care, and advocacy, Professor Davidson's work focuses on person-centred care delivery and the improvement of cardiovascular health outcomes for women and vulnerable populations. She has extensively studied chronic conditions, transitional care, palliative care, and the translation of innovative, acceptable, and sustainable health initiatives across the world.

Professor Davidson serves as counsel general of the International Council on Women's Health Issues, and was a past board member of CUGH and Secretary-General of the Secretariat of the World Health Organizations Collaborating Centres for Nursing and Midwifery. She also serves on the Board of Health Care Services for the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine in the United States.



Dr Bukola Salami

Dr Bukola Salami is an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Nursing, University of Alberta. She received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Windsor and her Master of Nursing and PhD in Nursing from the University of Toronto. Her research program focuses on policies and practices shaping migrants' health. She has led research projects on African immigrant child health, immigrant mental health, access to healthcare for immigrant children, Black youth mental health, health of internally displaced children, and parenting practices of African immigrants. She founded and leads an African migrant child research network of 35 scholars from 4 continents.

In 2020, she founded the Black Youth Mentorship and Leadership Program at the University of Alberta. The program, the first University based interdisciplinary mentorship program for Black youths in Canada, seeks to socially and economically empower Black high school youths to contribute meaningfully to the Canadian society. Her work on Black youth mental health led to the creation of a mental health clinic in Alberta. She has also presented her work to policy makers. In March 2021, she was invited to present her work to Prime Minister of Canada Justin Trudeau and four other ministers.

She is involved in several community volunteer initiatives including serving as a public member on the Council of the Alberta College of Social Worker, the Public Health Agency of Canada Working Group on the Mental Health of Black Canadian, the Bell Lets Talk Funding advisory committee, and active involvement with the Black Opportunities Fund. She is an Associate Editor of the Canadian Medical Association Journal (CMAJ) and on the Editorial Board of Nursing Inquiry and Qualitative Health Research Journal.

Dr. Salami has received several awards for research excellence and community engagement: 100 Accomplished Black Women in Canada; Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing Emerging Nurse Researcher of the Year Award; College and Association of Registered Nurses of Alberta (CARNA) Award for Nursing Excellence; and Alberta Avenue Edmonton Top 40 under 40. In 2020, she became a recipient of the Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society International Nurse Researcher Hall of Fame, the highest research award in nursing. In 2021, she became a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Nursing.



Howard Catton

Howard was appointed the Chief Executive Officer of the International Council of Nurses (ICN) in February 2019. He is committed to ensure that ICN effectively represents nursing worldwide, advances the nursing profession, promotes the wellbeing of nurses and advocates for health in all policies.

Throughout his career Howard has worked and written extensively on issues relating to the Nursing and Healthcare Workforce and he co-chaired the first ever State of the World's Nursing Report. He has led ICN's work to respond to and support nurses globally during the pandemic and has been at the forefront of advocating for the protection of and investment in the nursing profession.

Howard joined ICN in April 2016 as the Director, Nursing, Policy and Programmes. His team led the development of ICN policy and position statements. He also coordinated ICN Programmes and projects and oversaw the development of scientific programmes for ICN events.

Howard qualified as a Registered Nurse in 1988 and held a variety of nursing posts in England and the United States and worked for the New Zealand Nurses Organisation. He studied Social Policy at Cardiff University (BSc Econ Hons) and Industrial Relations at Warwick University (MA) and then worked as a Personnel and Organisational Change Manager in the National Health Service in the UK. For 10 years Howard was Head of Policy & International Affairs at the Royal College of Nursing in the UK.



Professor Petra Brysiewicz

Petra Brysiewicz is a full professor in the Discipline of Nursing, School of Nursing & Public Health, University of KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa and an honorary full professor in the Division of Emergency Medicine, Department of Surgery, Faculty of Health Sciences at the University of Cape Town, South Africa. She has worked with research and education of health professionals, primarily nurses, in South Africa and Africa for over 22 years, predominantly in the area of acute/emergency care.

Petra is the communicating PI for DEVELOPING RESEARCH INNOVATION, LOCALISATION AND LEADERSHIP (DRILL) programme within the College of Health Sciences, University of KwaZulu-Natal, South Africa, funded by Fogarty International Center of the National Institutes of Health, USA. Her efforts are focused on inter-professional mentoring and research leadership development for young health researchers. Petra is the Editor-in-Chief of the International Emergency Nursing journal and Associate Editor for a number of other journals.

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Dr Simeon Olubiyi

Dr. OLUBIYI Simeon Kayode was born over five decades ago and hails from Erin-Ile, Kwara State in Nigeria. He had his Bachelor's degree in Nursing Science University of Nigeria Nsukka (1992 - 1995). He had his Master of Science degree in Community Health and Epidemiology, University of Ilorin (1997 – 1998). He bagged a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) in Public Health, University of Ilorin (2009 to 2014).

He was a Course Coordinator (Head) of the Nursing and Community Health programme at the National Open University of Nigeria between 2003 and 2012. He is the Acting Head, Department of Nursing Science, University of Ilorin. (2015-2017). He was a Reader and Acting Head of Department of Nursing Science at Achievers University, Owo, Ondo State during his Sabbatical Leave.

He is a Fellow, West African College of Nursing (FWACN), in the Faculty of Community Health, Fellow, Commonwealth Programme (FCP), United Kingdom and a Fellow, African Institute of Public Health (FAIPH).

He has written and co-authored well over Thirty (30) Instructional course materials in Nursing and Community Health for the National Open University of Nigeria, He has numerous publications in reputable National and International Journals, and contributed chapters in 3 textbooks. He has Made presentations and proceedings in not less than 20 academic and professional conferences.

His professional associations include: National Association of Nigerian Nurses and Midwives (NANNM), Nigerian Ophthalmic Nurses Association (NONA), Health Economics Association of Nigeria and African Public Health Institute and Alumni of Hagai Institute (HI) and President of Men's Fellowship of Champions Church Headquarters in Ilorin, Kwara State. He is married to a nurse and the marriage is blessed with two children and grandchildren. His hobbies include Music and Reading.

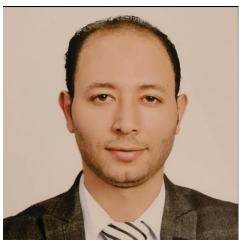


Olanike Idowu

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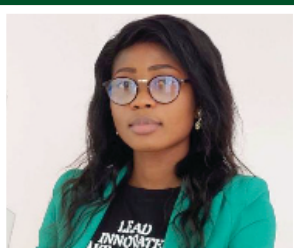
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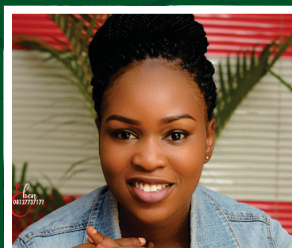
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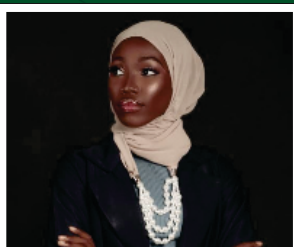
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
